## Melanie Bray; New CPSU/CSA Assistant Secretary

After 21 years as a member of the CPSU/CSA, Melanie Bray has been appointed Assistant Branch Secretary.

Starting her career as Client Assistant in a Disability Services group home, Melanie joined the Union at her workplace induction.

"I didn't come from a family of Unionists and didn't really know the role of Unions in the workplace, but I joined on my first day and a few years later my colleagues nominated me to be a Delegate at Disability Services," she said.

After some significant wins working on workplace agreements and the reclassification of social trainers, she joined the CPSU/CSA as an organiser in 2008.

"I am determined to continue to build our great Union and continue the work of the leaders who came before me. I know the power and passion public sector workers have and their commitment to the incredible work they do. I am honoured to work alongside our members and delegates as they advocate for the people who serve the Western Australian community in the WA public sector."

In November 2018, Melanie was appointed Assistant Branch Secretary to the CPSU/CSA.
